

Credit Recovery (VAS/VDS) Registration Packet

The Credit Recovery Program is by invitation only and may not be available at every high school. Please contact your school counselor for scheduling options.

The Credit Recovery Program is designed for students who benefit from a structured learning environment and need to recover core content area credits required for graduation.

Students and parents/guardians should know and agree to the general principles of this program before registering.

1. TIME and COMMITMENT

- Students are only permitted to take one Virtual After School (VAS) or Virtual During School (VDS) at a time.
- Students are enrolled in an online course taught by an FCPS teacher. Students will receive daily or weekly support from a school-based mentor. Students can and should work on the course beyond the time spent at school.
- A substantial commitment is required by the student. Online learning is NOT the best option for all learners.
- Students should make and keep a schedule that commits 5 to 10 quality hours each week for the course.
- Students meet with their mentor as determined by home school and set goals for course completion.
- All courses must be completed by the end of the school year.

2. ATTENDANCE

- Virtual During School (VDS)- Students are expected to attend daily.
- Virtual After School (VAS)- Students are expected to attend at least 2 after school sessions each week.
 - Students should not miss more than 2 sessions a month. More than 2 absences may result in removal from course.
- Students should be active and submitting assignments weekly in the course.
- Students with extended inactivity, as determined by FCVS staff, may result in removal from the course.
- Absences related to extracurricular activities, vacation, or work schedules are not excused.

3. LOCATION and TRANSPORTATION

- **Participating FCPS High Schools if available**
- Students provide their own transportation.

4. COMMUNICATION

- Students and parents are each required to provide FCVS with current working email addresses (**Students must use their FCPS email (@my.fcps.org)**)
- The vast majority of all communication with students and parents is conducted using email.

5. GRADES and the TRANSCRIPT

- Bi-weekly progress reports will be sent to students, parents, and counselors via email.
- Mid-term and final exams (at a minimum) must be taken at school with the mentor.
- Only 1 formal grade will be issued and sent to the student's home school upon completion of the course.
- Term grades are not issued for report cards. Therefore, student eligibility is not impacted.
- FCPS Regulations are followed regarding plagiarism.

6. FORMAL EDUCATION PLANS

- Many students with IEPs and/or 504 plans have successfully earned credit in online courses. However, this instructional model is not the best option for all learners, or able to support all accommodation needs. Students with formal education plans are enrolled on a case-by-case basis through collaboration between FCVS and the home school staff.

7. REGISTRATION and FEES

- Students register with their school counselor.
- There is no fee for VAS or VDS credit recovery programs.

FORMAL LEARNING PLANS AND VIRTUAL COURSES FOR CREDIT

AGREEMENT PREMISE

Formal learning plans are designed for implementation in a traditional classroom in a comprehensive school setting. FCVS programs offer different levels of support in various learning environments. Students with formal education plans are enrolled on a case-by-case basis with collaboration between Virtual School Administration, Special Education case managers, and school counselors.

We have read and understand the following points regarding implementation of accommodations in the online learning environment:

1. Many students with IEPs and/or 504 plans have successfully earned credit in online courses. However, this instructional model is not the best option for all learners, or able to support all accommodation needs.
2. Many accommodations are integrated into virtual courses. Some accommodations may not be provided.
3. Accommodations may be provided differently than in the traditional school setting.
4. Successful Online Learner Attributes include:

➤ Self-motivated to direct their own learning	➤ Consistent attendance patterns
➤ Level of maturity to collaborate with the online instructor and/or mentor	➤ Submit work in a timely manner based on the syllabus timeline
➤ Willing to ask for help or clarification when needed	➤ Must be willing to work outside of required program face to face time with instructors
