Begin the first paragraph of your research paper with a half-inch indent. Your first sentence is what should immediately follow the title. Do not do anything special to your title such as underlining or putting it in quotation marks.

As your paper develops, you will want to incorporate your research. Sometimes you will use direct quotes that “duplicate the original source word for word” (Rebetsky). Other times, you will put the ideas from your research into your own words, and that paraphrased material must also be cited in-text (Newcomb 3). You cite a website with an author the same way you would an article (Lake). Even if your information came from a website without an author, you must cite the source using the first word or first couple words of the title in quotation marks (“Don’t Forget”).

At the end of your paper, you will list all of your sources in a Works Cited list. The Works Cited list begins on a new page and must be included in every research paper. Continue the numbering sequence for this page.
